6 Principles of effective governance

Introduction to Governance

Congratulations on becoming a school governor. Governors are one of the largest volunteer forces in the country and have an important part to play in raising school standards. The role of the Governing Board is absolutely key to the effectiveness of a school. Time and time again Ofsted (the national inspection body for schools) has noted that the most effective schools demonstrate effective leadership and management - including by the governing board.

Becoming a school governor can be enjoyable and rewarding. The introduction to governance programme supports you to understand the basic information you need to start learning about your school and making a difference to the educational standards it provides.

Introduction to Governance

Course Detail: An introduction into the basics of governance. Using the Governance handbook as our guide, we aim to ensure you understand your roles and responsibilities. We will support you to develop an understanding of key questions such as;

- What is the difference between 'strategic' and 'operational' decision making?
- How to comply with the code of conduct, and the Nolan Principles.
- What are the accountability measures for governance and your remit?

Holding your Headteacher to Account

Course Detail: Building on the Governance basics, we examine the accountability for educational standards. What resources should Governance boards use to build an effective, open and honest dialogue with their Educational Leaders? The links between high quality teaching and pupil performance and the importance of a broad and balanced curriculum are examined, alongside the role of monitoring and evidence scrutiny.

Governance and Compliance

Course Detail: Building on the Governance basics, we explore the legal and regulatory requirements your board is expected to operate within, including;

- Educational legislation,
- Employment legislation,
- Health & safety legislation, etc.
- Procedures and process
- Principles of delegation.



The role of Governors in the classroom

Course details: Visits into school to carry out monitoring activities and getting to know your school is important for good Governance. Our tutor carefully examines the dos and don'ts of this activity and how effective visits to school can assist the board to fulfil its core functions.

Dealing with Complaints

Course Detail: This course uses the latest DfE guidance to look at how good practice in complaint procedures can support effectiveness in schools. There will also be full clarity on dealing with difficult situations such as running Governor panels for parental complaints and dealing with complaints about your Headteacher.

Measuring effective Governance

Course Detail: Evaluation is a part of the annual planning cycle that often gets forgotten. All Boards must be a reflective entity and assess their own effectiveness, structure and forward planning. What impact has the Board made? How effective is our Chair in his/her role?



Preparation for Ofsted

Course Detail: An advanced level course for schools due to be inspected, to support their understanding of the expectations of Ofsted inspections, especially with regard to Governance.

Performance Management (PM) & Performance Related Pay (PRP)

Course Detail: An advanced level course that explores how PM should be managed in your school. We will examine how to challenge both policy and process appropriately, hold your Headteacher to account for teacher performance and effectively scrutinise proposed pay reviews.

Managing Pupil Exclusions

Course Detail: This course covers the context and role of Governors within the exclusions process. Looking at national and local guidance, legislation and good practice, focus is given to clarify the roles of Headteachers, Governors and the Local Authority.

Safeguarding annual update for named Governors

Course Detail: An advanced level course that provides ongoing CPD for those who have already undertaken the Safeguarding for named Governors session. This course will give you essential updates in regard to legislation, guidance and good practice around the subject of Safeguarding.
